Food, drink and life at The Ship

In the summer, it's about outside drinks, barbecues and beach cricket during the day, and lovely dinners of fabulous fresh seafood, meat, veggies and fruit by night. In the winter, it's about crackling log fires, staying inside out of the cold, and maybe tapping your feet to some local live music.

Whatever the season, and whatever your age, you'll probably do it with a glass in your hand. In the summer it's **rosé wine, Pimm's and crisp ales**. In the winter it's **delicious red wines, warming malt whiskies and tasty local beers**. There are always plenty of **non-alcoholic options** – or even our own fabulous teas. Hopefully this drinks list gives you a few ideas.

Our main passion is **wine**. We have been lucky enough to travel to many of the world's great wine regions, we have met the growers and the winemakers, picked the grapes, and experienced the oftenamazing places in which wine grapes are grown. Among others, this list contains wines from New Zealand, South Africa, France, Portgual and Spain where we have been lucky enough to meet the team out there and taste the grapes. We encourage you to drink great wine to match the fantastic surroundings, so those who know, know to go to the slightly higher-priced wines on the list which offer the best value of all. By all means do ask for the **Captain's Selection** if you want something out of the ordinary, often in a larger format.

Cocktails are an increasing part of our offering, and we have an ever-changing list combining the classics with drinks that are bang on-trend. We would like to highlight Gordon the barman's popular **Bloody Mary**, but we are also serving plenty of **Aperol Spritz** and Rachel's new favourite for 2023, **White Port and Tonic**, re-discovered on a cheeky weekend trip to Porto.

Gin, of course, there are many, but we have been selective to bring you the best, the most interesting and the most local. Edinburgh Gin, Pilgrim's and *Isle of Harris* are three of our favourites. (The Pilgrim's Bramble is also great as an accompaniment to our cheese board). Our growing rum selection is led by the bar teams' favourite, **Reaper's Rum**. Naturally we have whisky (no 'e' in the Scottish version) from all five of the malt regions, and a few others from Ireland, Tennessee and further afield.

Choose an old favourite or try something new; ask the bar staff to recommend something from Scotland; or just take a chance. Enjoy it (in moderation, of course), enjoy the company, and enjoy The Ship Inn.
